



GSUMC Administrative Board Meeting Minutes - November 12, 2023

- 1. Revised GSUMC Website launched. Many thanks to Ms. Hannah Lynch for her help. The Church is looking for a volunteer to be webmaster to handle future website updates.
- 2. Solar panels and new LED lighting will be installed and operational by the end of December 2023. The benefit to GSUMC, in addition to significant savings in the cost of utilities, is a Federal Rebate Program which will cash return circa \$30,000 to the Church for the solar panel installation
- 3. The Eagle Scout project (Christopher Schankweiler, Troop 417) of a pergola on the east side of the Church building will commence in late November
- 4. Several Administrative Board vacancies will open up in 2024. The Nominations Committee is accepting and soliciting candidates. The Administrative Board is undergoing an organizational change from a single Board to two: an Administrative Board (retaining responsibilities for Staff-Congregation relations, Board of Trustees, and Finance Committee) and a new Ministries Board (responsibilities for communication, publicity, support and growth of church membership, support of various church ministries). The volunteers will be asked which AdMin board they would like to serve on.
- 5. The 2023 GSUMC Charge Conference is scheduled for December 3 at 5 PM at the church. Members are encouraged to attend and cast their vote for items such as approving the Administrative Board reorganization.
